Looking out for one another

Please be vigilant at all times for events that don't seem "quite right". Sharing your concerns with your neighbour or coordinator is what Neighbourhood Watch is all about. Just jot down as much detail as you can as soon as you can - The Report Form overleaf should give you some guidance.

Look out for and report antisocial behaviour (including speeding/noisy vehicles and dog fouling).

Look out for our public buildings that are frequently unoccupied e.g. Dasset School. Please report any unusual out of hours activity.

There have been two recent **burglaries** in the village, both in broad daylight. Please ensure that your property is secure **at all times** and anyone who considers themselves vulnerable should not open the door to strangers. More advice available from your coordinator or pick up a "Yellow Box" from the Post Office.

There have also been a number of **thefts of diesel** and **number plates** in the vicinity. There are anti-theft devices available to combat both crimes. Make it difficult for the would-be thief and easy for yourself.

Please ensure that all types of theft are reported to the police.

Fenny Compton Neighbourhood Watch Incident Reporting

In an emergency or if you see a crime in progress call 999 otherwise call the Warwickshire Police Central Phone Number 01926 415000 and ask for the Control Room. Advise them that you are a Neighbourhood Watch Member. To give information about a serious crime and should you wish to remain anonymous call Crimestoppers 0800 555 111.

Record the Incident Number (including date)

About the crime - record as much information as you can as soon as you can in the box below. Any or all of the following items may be relevant.

1. What did you see and hear?
2. What appeared to be the target of the crime?
3. When? Date & time - Was there another linked event?
4. Who? Description (hair and skin colour, height and build, age, clothing, distinctive features) and number of those involved. Were there other witnesses?
5. Where? Location of incident and means and direction of departure.
6. Was a vehicle involved? Description and vehicle registration number (VRN).

Report

The downloadable Report Form
has space for your observations

Accurate recording of an incident may help with a related insurance claim.

Remember that provided you are assured of your own safety then turning on a light or calling out may well be enough to prevent/minimise a crime.

Advise your coordinator at a convenient time that you have reported an incident.
